Aviation Security Training Course 2022

Air Cargo and Mail Security (Virtual Class) 14 - 18 March / USD 650

This five-day course is designed to ensure that the relevant personnel can integrate knowledge of Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs) into the context of their designated role in their organization as part of a national responsibility to secure air cargo and mail against acts of unlawful interference, through the application of the relevant competencies and in accordance with Annex 17 and the ICAO Aviation Security Manual (Doc 8973 - Restricted).

Security Culture Workshop (Virtual Class) 28 March - 1 April/ USD 650

This four-day intertactive workshop is designed to familiarize participants with the development of Security Culture, which is one of the key priority outcomes of the ICAO Global Aviation Security Plan (GASeP). The promotion of effective security culture is critical to achieve good security outcomes and the existence of a well-trained, motivated and professional work force is a prerequisite for effective aviation security. Therefore, the workshop focuses on interactive exercises that enable the participants to learn how to develop, implement, and maintain robust and positive security culture within their organization. Recognizing that a strong security culture must be developed from the top management across and within every organization, the participants should be responsible for the development and implementation of security culture and security measures, and may include but not be limited to, middle and senior management from the appropriate authority for aviation security, police and intelligence services, airport and airline operators, and other aviation security stakeholders.

Aviation Security National Instructors 15 - 19 August / USD 650

This five-day course is designed to enable aviation security instructors to perform a competency-based and effective role in the delivery of their national aviation security (AVSEC) training activities, through the application of the relevant competencies and in accordance with Annex 17 and the ICAO Aviation Security Manual (Doc 8973 – Restricted). The participants should be involved in the development, management and/or instruction of training materials related to a national civil aviation security training programme.

Air Cargo and Mail Security* (Virtual Class) 19 - 23 September / Please liaise with the ICAO Regional Office

This five-day course is designed to ensure that the relevant personnel can integrate knowledge of Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs) into the context of their designated role in their organization as part of a national responsibility to secure air cargo and mail against acts of unlawful interference, through the application of the relevant competencies and in accordance with Annex 17 and the ICAO Aviation Security Manual (Doc 8973 - Restricted).

Crisis Management Workshop (Virtual Class) 10 - 14 October / USD 650

This five-day workshop is designed to provide management personnel with the knowledge and skills needed to develop and implement sound crisis management procedures. This workshop will provide the personnel at the senior or middle management level of organizations within a State that have been assigned responsibility under that State's National Civil Aviation Security Programme to form part of the crisis management element to respond to acts of unlawful interference occurring within that State.

Aviation Security National Inspectors 15 - 23 November / USD 910

This seven-day course is designed to provide aviation security personnel with theoretical and practical knowledge of audits and inspections as part of a national civil aviation security quality control programme. Participants who successfully complete this course will be prepared to plan, coordinate and conduct quality control measures utilizing Annex 17 and ICAO methodology in accordance with approved programmes.

Risk Management Workshop (Virtual Class) 5 - 9 December / To be confirmed

This four day interactive workshop designed for aviation security management personnel, focuses on risk management as it applies to protecting civil aviation against acts of unlawful interference. The workshop will provide participants with the opportunity to assess risk through the identification and evaluation of threats, consequences and vulnerabilities. This workshop will expose participants to guidance material incorporated in the ICAO Global Risk Context Statement and provide the skills necessary to apply risk management methodology when determining the appropriate level of security measures to be implemented. Nominees should be directly involved in the assessment or management of threats, vulnerabilities and/or risk on behalf of their State, to include but not limited to the appropriate authority for aviation security, National Police, Intelligence Services, or, airports, airlines and other aviation security stakeholder.
